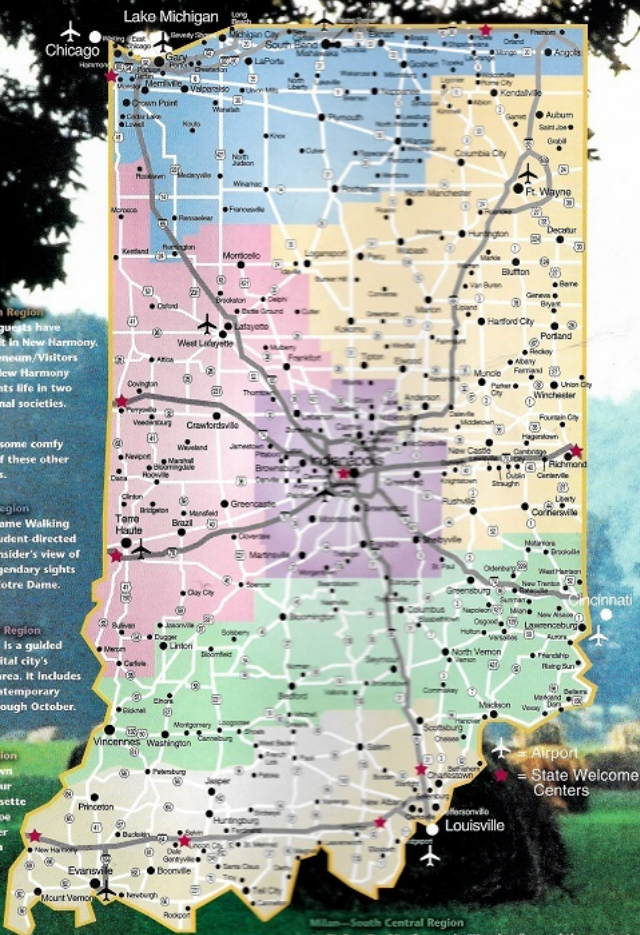

INDIANAPOLIS MOTOR SPEEDWAY

HALL OF FAME MUSEUM



The official program guide to the first **Indy 500 Race** in 1911 proclaimed the Indianapolis Motor Speedway as "the greatest race course in the world." The famed track retains this distinction some 90 years later. The **Indianapolis Motor Speedway Hall of Fame Museum** celebrates a Hoosier tradition that entertains and inspires people the world over.

The "Wasp," the car that won that first race, is on display here, along with numerous other winning cars and priceless memorabilia. Also, view examples of cars built in Indianapolis, including the Stutz, Cole, Marmon, National and Duesenberg. Historic photographs, trophies and helmets, which adorn the walls of the Hall of Fame Museum, show the close connection between Indiana's role in the auto industry and its top role in auto racing.

The Tony Hulman Theatre offers an exciting 20-minute film, highlighting Indy's 500-mile race, which is included in the admission price. The Official Trackside Gift Shop carries an extensive variety of official souvenirs; everyone will find something interesting here. Don't leave without taking a trip around the track! Adjacent to the world's most famous race course, the Brickyard Crossing Golf Resort & Inn provides a rare blend of history with a sense of freshness. 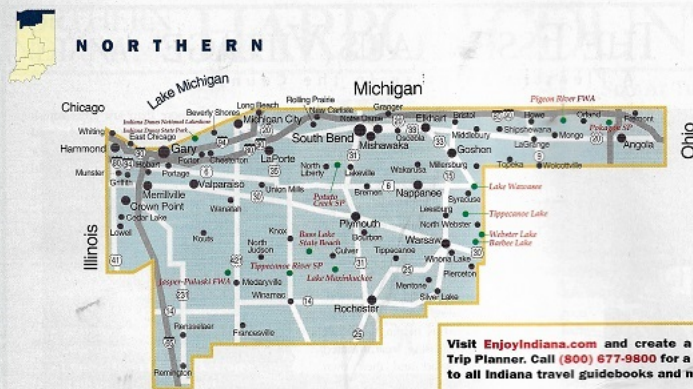

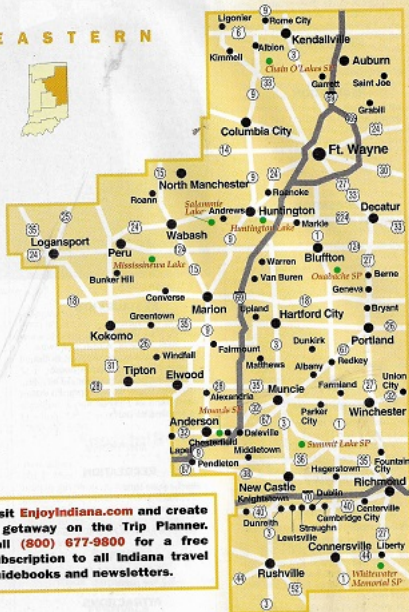

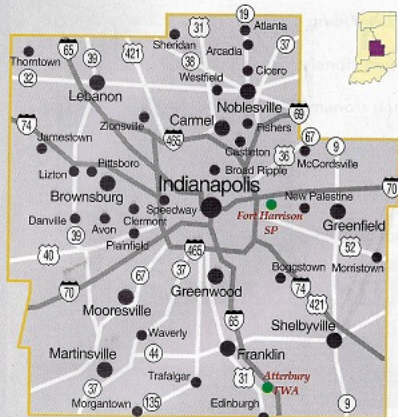
