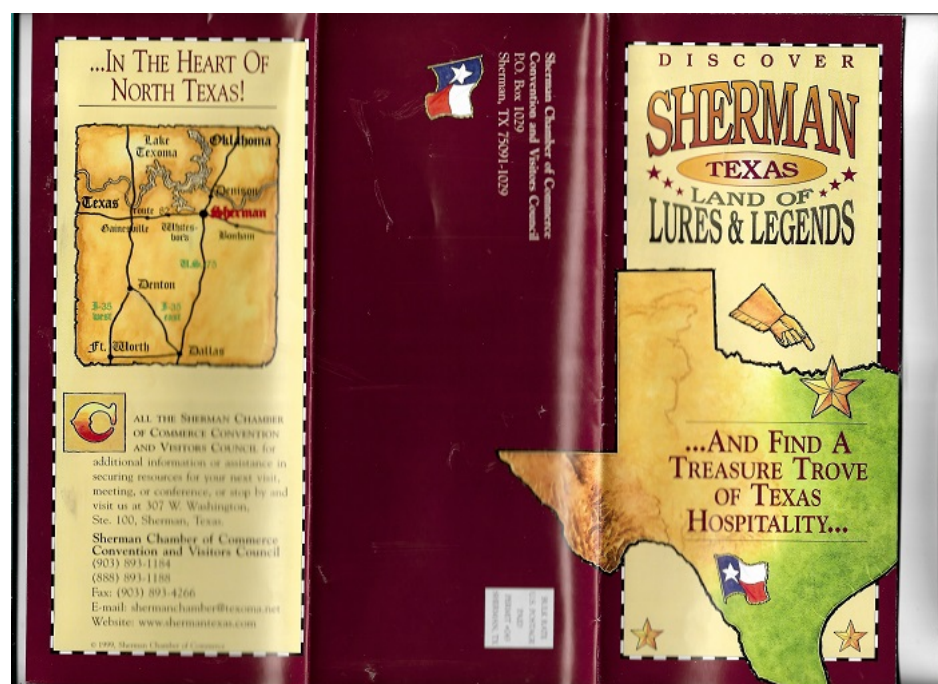

EXCITING ATTRACTIONS AND HISTORICAL SITES:

Some Lures and a few Legends...

- 1 **AUSTIN COLLEGE** - 900 N. Grand Avenue. General Sam Houston and Anson Jones, Presidents of the Republic of Texas, served on Austin College's original Board of Trustees. (903) 813-2000.
- 2 **CONFEDERATE MONUMENT** - Courthouse Square. Erected on April 3, 1896, this was the first confederate monument in Texas. (903) 813-4200.
- 3 **GRAYSON COUNTY COLLEGE** - Hwy 691. West campus features public golf course and Munson Viticulture Center. (903) 465-6030.
- 4 **GRAYSON COUNTY FRONTIER VILLAGE** - Loy Lake Road. The village includes a museum and collection of rustic structures from the 19th century. Open mid-May to mid-October. (903) 463-2487.
- 5 **HAGERMAN NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE** - North on FM 1417, 3 miles north of Highway 691, marked by signs. The refuge is a well-documented haven for migrating and wintering waterfowl in the Big Mineral arm of

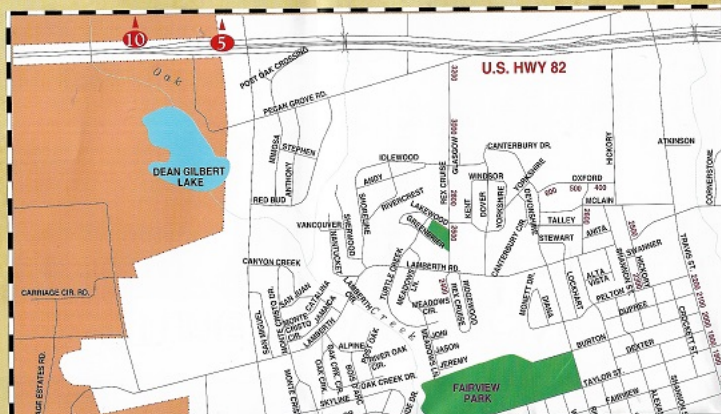
ANTIQUE SHOPS - Sherman offers an assortment of establishments with a wide range of collections and interests.

GOLF COURSES - Several outstanding courses are available, and greens fees are reasonable.

Haven Park on Dewey Avenue.

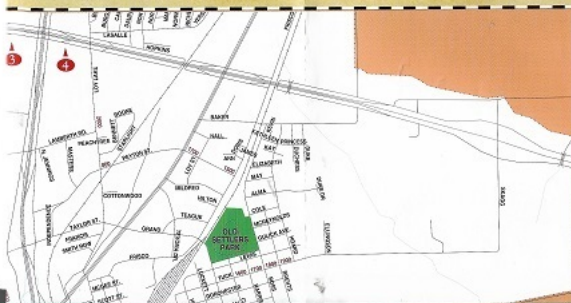

6 HERITAGE ROW OF HOMES - 300 to 1300 blocks of South Crockett. This neighborhood offers visitors an architecturally rich enclave of restored Victorian-style homes to enjoy.

7 MARCY'S BUTTERFIELD TRAIL CROSSING - 404 W. Washington. Historical site marks Marcy's California Trail (1849) and Butterfield Stage Trail (1858).



8 MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. MONUMENT - This monument dedicated to the black civil rights leader is located at the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Park on East Street.

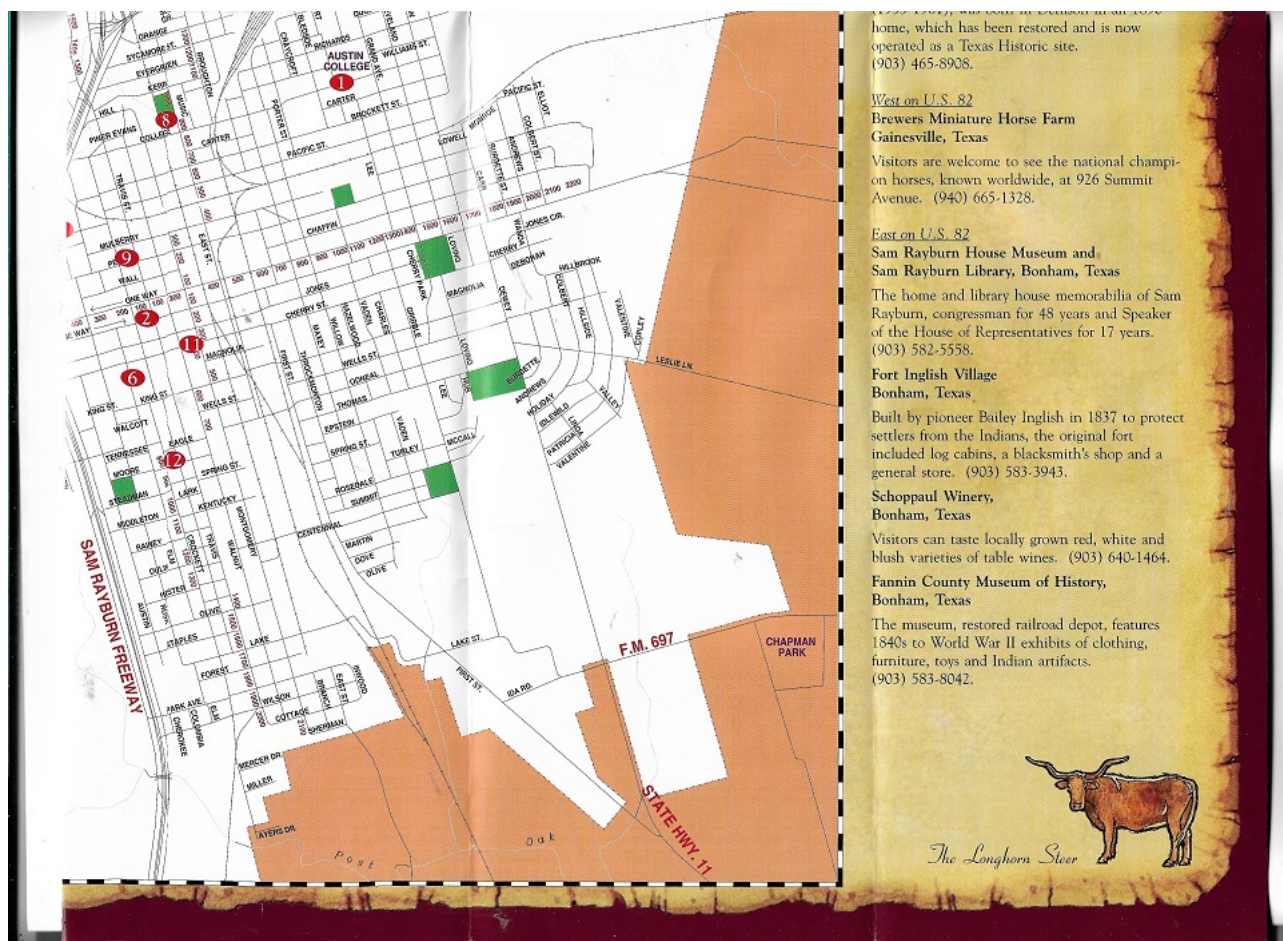
9 R.D. SHERMAN OFFER HOUSE - 300 North Travis. Originally a three-story Victorian structure with twin towers, this historic building was remodeled in 1961 for commercial purposes.

10 BERTON CEMETERY Located on Preston Peninsula at Lake Texoma, the cemetery marks the graves of William Coffee and Sophia Foster. A state marker commemorates the Indian Trade Post established by Coffee in 1831.

11 RED RIVER HISTORICAL MUSEUM - 301 S. Warner. The museum is used in the former Carnegie Library, built in 1914 and recorded in the National Register of Historic Places. Visitors will enjoy a variety of exhibits.

12 ROBERTS HOME 945 S. Crockett. One of the beautiful homes and quaint streets maintained by the Preservation League.
